## 2023 LIHEAP Funding Fact Sheet: Georgia

## What is LIHEAP?

From staying warm in the winter to keeping cool in the summer, for more than 40 years, the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) has provided federally funded assistance to help individuals and families maintain safe and healthy indoor temperatures.

LIHEAP helps low-income households pay home heating and cooling bills, prevent energy shutoffs, restore services, make minor energyrelated home repairs, and weatherize homes to make them more energy efficient.

## 2023 LIHEAP Funds: Georgia

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), through the Office of Community Services (OCS) at the Administration for Children and Families (ACF), announced the release of \$4,492,719,317 through LIHEAP to all 50 states, the District of 2023 LIHEAP Funds: Georgia

Georgia was awarded a total of \$116,782,170 to assist low-income families ahead of the winter season. This includes:

- \$72,933,326 from the regular LIHEAP block grant funding
- \$40,269,096 in supplemental funding
- \$3,579,748 in funding appropriated for FY 2023 from President Biden's Bipartisan Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act<sup>1</sup>
